### **Minutes:**

### **Guest Presentations:**

- Lori Grigg presented Ditto, a Golden Retriever who is trained to assist the hearing impaired, and Henry – he is a Black Lab trained as an assistance dog to help the physically challenged. Lori and her business partner Beth Spanski trained assistance dogs in their Leslie MI business. Henry will be a door greeter at the Henry Ford Hospital starting in January 2009. Lori explained the Assistance Dog Training and the reason that they are a productive part of society and how they can assist those people who are in need of their services. Their goal is to train 20 dogs a year. In

this group will be dogs to assist GI's returning home from Iraq and Afghanistan. Lori and Beth are seeking assistance to support their not for profit organization.

He is licensed to buy and sell Gold. He has promised the Post 10% of his profits for the 2 days. A motion was presented by M. ### **Legion Riders:**

- M. McDonnell reported that the Legion Riders have a new director. The past director Jack Olmstead moved to Virginia to accept a job there and has been replaced by Butch Maxwell.
- J. Nelson reported that the By-Laws are being reviewed and revised to update safety requirements for rides. The requirement for non-members to sign a waiver of liability and release emergency contact information.

### **House:**

- Reported by Tony Puente: A scout fell and broke his arm in 2 places and a finger on the retaining rock wall. The injuries are covered by the Boy Scouts Insurance Policy. R. Mathison recommended the possible use of Landscape Glue to secure the rocks. J. Nelson recommended consideration of possibly fencing the area off as place of honor rather than signs. It was also reported that during events at the Post children have been observed unsupervised climbing on the retaining walls, as well as the tank out front. M. McDonnell reported that the Contract for the Hall Rental has a liability release in it.

Bonnie presented an amendment to the original motion to read any Active Duty Member who is KIA and any close family member. Support was C. Bowman. B. Janoska made a motion to table the motion and amendment. Commander Nelson tabled the original motion and amendment.
- Bonnie Welbaum reported on the Commanders Meeting in Grand Rapids. Points of interest were:
  1. Making halls accessible to disabled veterans a priority.
  2. Recommended allowance increase for travel to VA Hospitals.

3. October 22/23 Stand-down at the State Fair Grounds cost the VA Fund \$6,000.00.
4. The new director of Ft. Custer in Battle Creek was introduced.
5. The Assistant Director of GLNC was introduced.
6. 2 new centers are being planned for veterans with nerve and spinal cord injuries.

- **Veterans Day:** Commander Nelson thanked all who participated, and reported that the event is growing.
