FROM THE COMMANDER. John R. Nelson

Greetings to you all.

I trust that your summer was as filled with fun and family as you had hoped.

It is again my pleasure to tell you about the good things that are happening in POST 216 and in the American Legion in Michigan. I'll begin close to home.

• Milford's annual American Legion Memorial Day Parade was a huge success. I truly hope that each of you have been part of this event. For me it has been a defining event in my reawakening to the need to serve military veterans in our community. At no other time in my life, only during this parade in Milford, have I experience the outpouring of gratitude from the whole community for what I did while wearing the uniform of the U.S. Army. Sure, many individuals have said "Thank You," but only here have I truly felt the thanks of my neighbors and friends. Our guest of honor this year was the Michigan National Guard Deputy Commander for Veterans Affairs, Brigadier General Carol Ann Fausone. The response from BG Fausone was a mixture of amazement, awe, and gratitude. Her comment to me was that this parade in Milford is the best one she has ever been part of anywhere in Michigan. My hat is off in salute to everyone who made the parade such a success, and in particular, my thanks to Joe Salvia, Tony Puente, Joan Kowal and the Auxiliary, and Mike McDonnell and Butch Maxwell and all of the SAL. This parade is THE signature event for Post 216. It has

succeeded because so many post family members are involved. And, this parade will continue to get better as more veterans, more Auxiliary members, and more Sons decide to lend a hand.

- At the end of May each year, your Legion • officers compile the Consolidated Post Report to the Department of Michigan. In that report we are able to share, in short-hand fashion, what we accomplished during the prior year. I am pleased to report that on many of the important measures of a healthy and active post, we of Post 216 scored very well. Membership is growing (more on that later), we provide honors and service to veterans in and around our community, we are active in programs the help influence children and youth toward a future as good citizens, and Post 216 is an important part of our community.
- The middle of June each year brings the Department of Michigan Convention, held in Grand Rapids.

Annually, Auxiliary Units around the state provide items for the Veteran's Christmas gift shops at veteran's hospitals around the state. All veteran's living at one of the Veteran's hospital can select a gift for the members of their immediate family free of charge. This year our Unit's gifts will go to the Ann Arbor hospital. Auxiliary members also staff the gift shop. They help each veteran select their gifts, wrap and mail them if the veteran will not be seeing their family during the holidays. CEREMONIAL EVENTS

Since the last newsletter our Color and Honor Guards have been very active in supporting community events and Veterans interment services both in the local area and at Great Lakes National Cemetery.

MEMORIAL DAY

The Legion Color and Honor Guards participated in the early morning memorial services at the Post, our local cemeteries, and assisted living facilities. They were the lead unit for the annual Memorial Day Parade and at Milford's Central Park they provided the color guard, and two rifle teams for the ceremony.

COLOR GUARD EVENTS

The Post Color Guard participated in the Milford and Lakeland graduation ceremonies, the Milford 4th of July Parade, several youth and Legion baseball opening ceremonies as well as community events such as Cancer Awareness, YMCA, and 911 Remembrances.

HONOR GUARD EVENTS

So far this calendar year the Post Honor Guard has participated in 49 interment ceremonies both at the local level and at Great Lakes National Cemetery. Included among them were full military honors for two of the areas more prominent veterans.

HONOR GUARD TRAINING

Rich Chowaniec coordinated the training of our honor guard with Jeffery Rector and his Army Reserve Training Team. They held two separate training classes in order accommodate all of our honor guard members. The training consisted of practicing correct procedures for flag folders, rifle teams, buglers and pall bearers. Upon completion of the class a Department of Defense certificate and pin was presented to each member.
