This year we will face a significant challenge with the new law banning smoking. I have personally reviewed the

text of the law, and concur with the statement issued by the American Legion Department of Michigan that "...all Michigan posts ... are **not exempt** from the state's new no smoking law....Effective May 1, 2010, the Michigan Public Code is amended to prohibit smoking in public places, in places of employment, and in food service establishments." Post 216 is affected by this new law because we both employ at least 1 person and we serve food on the property. So, as I understand how this law will be applied, there is no smoking allowed inside the building at all times. This will definitely affect activity in the club level, it will affect rental of the Post 216 Hall, and it will affect bingo. What we do not know yet is just how much effect it will have on our daily operation. We are committed to complying with the law, and we will be okay, even though this change is unwelcomed by many.


The following team members are responsible in making our Honor Guard one of the best, if not the best, in the American Legion:


