The remaining 100% squadrons in the Zone will get their plagues at the Convention. If your squadron makes 100% or better by the first report in May, your squadron will get a plaque. I am personally inviting each of the squadrons in the 3rd Zone to have a representative to attend the Detachment Convention. The members of the Zone will be electing the next Zone Commander for 2011/12 so having someone from your squadron present is important, your vote does count.

ATTENTION ALL SQUADRON COMMAND-ERS OF THIS DETACHMENT. I had committed to giving each of the squadron commanders in the 3rd Zone a 100% patch if their squadron reported 100% or better based on the first membership report in May. This was discussed between the Zone Commanders and brought up to the DEC in February. It was approved by vote of the DEC, that every Squadron Commander in the Detachment who gets 100% or better will receive the 100% patch. The first Department membership report in May 2011 will be used for issuing the 100% patch.

Please be sure your membership gets sent into Department as this report will also be the one used for Convention delegate votes. If your squadron gets 100% or better please have a representative attend the Convention to receive the Commanders patch.

I have posted my Winter Meeting report on

I invite all zone members that would like to get the various information that is sent out, to provide their email to me at misal3rdzone@comcast.net and I'll add you to the list. I am sure, that at least one member having an email would be willing to be the squadron contact for emailed information: this does not need to be an officer.

In early February, I sent to each squadron in the 3rd Zone either by email or regular mail copies of a simple boiler plate Squadron Constitution and By-Laws as found in the squadron handbook, with a few minor changes. These should be completed and two signed copies should be sent to the Detachment Judge Advocate. After approval, one copy will be returned with his signature indicating they have been approved. Each of your squadron members should be provided with an approved copy for their use.

The above was done in response that there are only ten copies on file of either squadrons or districts. So, you can see that this issue needs a lot of improvement. If your squadron needs a copy, you may send me a request to the above email address. I would like to see the 3rd Zone complete this task before the Convention, it can be done.

I am glad to be able to report that the 6^{th} and 8th Districts are in the process of forming their Sons District Associations and I encourage each of the squadrons to support this action. The Detachment goal is to have a Sons District Association for each of the districts to mirror our parent organization, The Department of Michigan and their District Associations. In the online handbook, the Districts are shown as part of the structure of the National Organization.

I am still working on a squadron all time high lists. If your squadron keeps the old membership rosters, this could be used to find your all-time high. For this project, I would like to have totals from at least 2005. If anyone has any old Detachment membership reports, I would like to get a copy, the older the better.

By the time you get this newsletter, you should have received the last updated information for the 3rd Zone Directory. The current section should be removed and the new one should be inserted in its place. Those without emails may be receiving theirs a little later but not later than the end of March.

If the members of the 3rd Zone have anv recammendations on how the Zone Commander can better serve its members please, let me know. I am looking for feedback that will help the Zone Commander to better serve. What do you expect from your Zone Commander? Let us know, so this information can be passed to the next commander.

Lastly, I want to thank the 3rd Zone members for their support and giving me the opportunity to serve as your Zone Commander and your work on membership. Without the local members and all their work, the Detachment and officers would be without meaning or purpose.

Hi, I am Nelson O'Bryan, newly appointed American Legion director of Michigan Boys State. I am very committed to making this program a success, but I cannot do it alone.

We need help from every Legion Family member. We need the Legion Zone Commanders to encourage the district commanders to ask the Legion posts for a commitment to send more boys to Boys State. Anyone can sponsor a boy or girl. If you ask other private clubs in your area, a lot of them will sponsor a student.

The students are at least 15 years old and in between their junior and senior year in high school. Presently the cost is \$310.00 for a week that shapes a lifetime. Although it started in 1935, too many people do not know what Boys and Girls State really is. It's a week long, hands on study of Ameri-

can politics and government. They actually set up their own 51st. state and run it for one week.

You can get more info from The American Legion website. Boys State will start on Father's Day June 19, 2011 at Northwood University in Midland, and anyone is welcome to visit and see the program in action. It will be very interesting to you.

I attended the Mid-Winter D.E.C. meeting held in February in Flint, Michigan. Here are some issues that The American Legion would like you to contact your Representative about:

Legion Opposes Proposal to Cut VA Spending

Responding to a proposal by Rep. Michele Bachmann (R-Minn.) to freeze VA health-care spending and cut veterans disability payments to help reduce federal spending, American Legion National Commander Jimmie L. Foster said his organization steadfastly opposes the initiative. "It is absurd to suggest such a thing when we are fighting two wars and creating more veterans every day who have served their country honorably and have already earned their henefits".

The plan, which proposes to cut a total of \$400 billion in federal spending, is derived from an Oct. 28 report from the Heritage Foundation that projects \$2.5 billion in savinos from a freeze on VA health-care spending increases, and \$1.9 billion in savings from scrapping disability payments for veterans already receiving Social Security Disability Income (SSDI). Peter Gaytan, executive director of The American Legion's office in Washington, said "Congress must find other ways to reduce federal spending that don't affect veterans' benefits and health care. "The need for high-quality veterans' health care certainly isn't decreasing, so the VA budget shouldn't, either. Congress needs to stay focused on providing an adequate budget to care for those who have made sacrifices in Irao. Afohanistan or in previnus wars "

Tim Tetz, legislative director of The American Legion, said the idea of taking SSDI away from veterans receiving disability payments "has been floated before and thankfully defeated every time. would anyone want to take away disability benefits veterans have already paid for, simply because they have earned additional benefits through their honorable service in the military?" The American Legion has consistently opposed any attempts by Congress to reduce or eliminate veterans' benefits. It considers such benefits as earned and has urged the federal government to find other methods to reduce its expanding budget.

The Legion stands by the sentiments expressed long ago by George Washington:

"The willingness with which our young people are likely to serve in any war, no matter how justified, shall be directly proportional to how they perceive the veterans of earlier wars were treated and appreciated by their nation."

National Commander Foster said "Of all the items in our federal budget that could be drastically cut, or dispensed with altogether, why would a member of Congress think it might be a good idea to take benefits away from those people who protect the very freedoms they operate under?" Commander Foster agreed that Congress needs to take decisive action in reducing the federal budget, "but we must be mindful of the sacrifices borne by the men and women who have served and sacrificed in America's armed forces."

Legislative Action Supported by Legion

The American Legion has over 200 resolutions of legislative intent that guide our actions in Congress. Balancing those against the direction and actions of Congress continually changes. Yet we have

some goals we have pursued in the past likely to remain a centerpiece of our agenda. They include:

- a) Funding for the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA): Since our organization's founding, caring for the veterans of America's conflicts has been a paramount concern of The American Legion. With the new Congress zeroing in on making budget reductions across the federal government, we will be all the more vigilant to insure that VA does not sustain reductions that will cripple its many programs. We believe modest increases in budget amounts are necessary to keep pace with an increasing veteran population and enhanced services to America's veterans.
- b) Disabled Veteran Tax (Concurrent Receipt): Service-connected disabled veterans should not have their retiree pay offset by their VA disability compensation.

The American Legion supports legislation that would completely repeal the Disabled Veteran Tax. Legislation to accomplish this objective has been re-introduced in the 112th Congress.

- c) Veteran Joblessness: It is a national travesty that America's veterans have a higher jobless rate that their non-veteran counterparts. The American Legion will address this inequity and seek solutions to reduce veteran joblessness.
- d) Flag Amendment With the changes in the makeup of the House of Representatives and the Senate, The American Legion will again diligently pursue consideration of this issue during the 112th Congress. In the House, Representative Jo Ann Emerson (MD) has introduced House Joint Resolution 13, to protect the American flag from desecration. Introduction of a Senate version is imminent.
- e) TRICARE increases to TRICARE premi-

ums are looming on the horizon as the Congress struggles to control this aspect of spending. TAL will have to work diligently to protect this important benefit to service members and ensure that the level of benefits is balanced against the sacrifices made by our service members.

Other legislative objectives may be added as the First Session of the 112th Congress continues. In the meantime, the list above should provide sufficient fodder for members of The American Legion family when the hold meetings with their elected officials or their staff members.



In 1952, Dr. Garland D. Murphy Jr. gave to The American Legion a large contribution that would benefit children. The Legion and Murphy entered into a trust agreement that established the Child Welfare Foundation, approved by the National Executive Committee on Oct. 15, 1953.

Though created by the Legion, the Child Welfare Foundation, Inc., is a separate 501(c)3 corporation.

CWF accepts funding proposals from nonprofit organizations for projects that contribute to the physical, mental, emotional and spiritual welfare of children. Grants are only given to entities that help U.S. children in a large geographic area; they are not awarded for day-to-day operating expenses or special operating expenses.

During CWF's annual board of directors meeting in Indianapolis on Oct. 10. The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation awarded \$666,670 to 21 nonprofit organizations. Because the Sons of The American Legion is an integral funding partner for the CWF, The SAL has an opportunity to help choose organizations that receive grants.

A couple of 2011 grant recipients are:

American Academy of Pediatrics of Elk Grove Village, Ill., was awarded \$14,725 for their project, "Pediatrics Journal-Military Supplement." This grant will produce a supplement to the AAP's Pediatrics journal to provide pediatricians with an overview of the role of the pediatrician in military medicine. The Role of the Pediatrician in Military Medicine will be published and distributed to 70,000 subscribers. The Sons of The American Legion sponsored this grant.

American Legion Children's Home of Ponca City, Okla., was awarded \$44,000 for their project, "American Legion Children's Home National Awareness Initiative Phase III." This grant will allow the Home to maintain its website, duplicate a six-minute documentary, print thousands of brochures and purchase new display materials. The American Legion Auxiliary and the Sons of The American Legion sponsored this grant.
