FROM THE COMMANDER: John R. Nelson

Greetings to all Legionnaires, Auxiliares, Sons, and Friends.

With this newsletter, I am starting a special section that will amplify a portion of the Preamble of the Constitution of the American Legion. We have all heard or recited that preamble, and as we reflect on the words, there is much to learn about our purpose as an organization.

In addition to that new section in our Post Newsletter, I will be sharing more in-depth about our priorities and programs as they fit within the framework of the National Organization's "Four Pillar" program.

For my first installment on the American Legion Constitution Preamble, I've chosen to discuss what I think is the most important thing that we can do at our local post:

"TO CONSECRATE AND SANCTIFY OUR COMRADESHIP BY OUR DEVOTION TO MUTUAL HELPFULNESS.

This is where the "rubber meets the road" for the members of our Legion Family. We are a community of friends and acquaintances who are all gathered around military veteran issues. But, what makes our gathering most special is that we are focused, as an organization, on helping each other. The American Legion is not a social organization. It is not a club. The American Legion is a service organization for military veterans. Mutual helpfulness is what we do, hundreds of times each month, in big ways that get lots of notice and in small ways that most of us take for granted. The American Legion is in the business of friends helping friends

So, I challenge myself and all of us as members of Post 216 to look for at least one way to be helpful, and make the special effort to do something good for veteran or Legion Family member.

Post 216 and the UAW-GM National Strike

Our Post was involved in a helping way during the recent UAW-GM labor strike.

What many of you, our membership, may not know is that one of our regular users of the hall is UAW Local 653, which represents the workers at the GM Milford Proving Ground. For some time they have used our hall as the site of their periodic Union meetings.

So, when the union membership needed a place to gather to organize their part in the national labor negotiations work stoppage, it made sense to assemble at Post 216. Some of you may have seen the large gathering on Monday September 24, and, even after the large gathering dispersed, Post 216 members who are also UAW-GM employees continued to support one another in Club 216.

Some of our membership may have heard that I, as Post Commander, expressed displeasure

that our Meeting Hall was being used on that Monday for a purpose I felt was not appropriate. Let me clear the air about that. My remarks were made without full knowledge of the relationship that Post 216 has with Local 653. Add in the fact that in my work life the past 27 years I have been part of General Motors management. So, in some ways my perspective and judgment were affected because I was looking at the situation with GM eyes, and not with eyes as the leader of a veteran service organization in our community.

Speaking on behalf of Post 216, we value all members of the Huron-Valley community, and we value our interactions and relationships with all the groups within that community. So long as we keep politics and business in their proper place, we welcome all or our fellow citizens, and especially any military veteran. Post 216 will continue to have cordial relations with Local 653, and I look forward to working together veterans issues.



MEMBERSHIP 2007 - 2008

My fellow Legionnaires, I have given a number of hours of thought to the subject of Membership. Finally I decided to present you with some trivia notes that I have obtained from reading the Department of Michigan Website and from our October 2007 Membership Meeting.

- For a Post that has 15 new members this year it will receive a \$75.00 and a Certificate as a part of the Bronze Brigade from Department. Post 216 has 22 new members as of October 17th.
- For a Post that has 25 new members this year it will receive \$125.00, and a Certificate as part of the Silver Brigade from Department. That is 3 more new members for Post 216.
- For a Post that has 50 new members this year it will receive \$250.00, and a Certificate as part of the Gold Brigade from Department. This is 28 more new members for Post 216.
- ➤ Post 216 has 318 total paid members and needs 71 more before December 31, 2007 to reach our goal of 100%. That if just over 1/3 of the total number needed to meet our goal are new members we will receive \$250.00 to apply against one of our worthy causes.
- Any Post that is 100% by December 31, 2007 will be invited to choose one Post Representative and guest to attend the National Commander's Dinner in Lansing as the Membership Director's guest in February 2008.
- Last year Post 216 tied for 3rd place for the most new members in the state of Michigan.



We all have a relative, neighbor, or friend from school who is a vet. Talk to them. Explain our programs and our Post to them. Invite them to join our ranks. Consider a gift membership. We want to be the #1 Post in Michigan this year. All we need is for 23% of our current members to bring in 1 new member each and we will have reached our goal of 100%. Just think if we make 150% of our goal. We have 2 1/2 months to giter-done.

You can obtain, and turn in the Membership Application along with a copy of the applicants DD Form 214, or discharge documentation, and their \$40.00 check or money order (first year dues) at the Post, to Bruce Hayden, or at the Meeting in November.

Good Luck lets keep membership foremost in our minds.
